Helpful TRAVEL ADVICE:

Arrival-Departure information for flights to Hawaii/Kona:

Once you are sure you are coming, please buy your plane ticket ASAP. Plan to arrive at Kona (aka Keahole) Airport (KOA) on the "Big Island" of Hawaii. If you want us to pick you up and bring you to our B&B, then plan to arrive on Jan. 28, preferably between the hours of 11am-7pm. We will begin picking up people at noon. If for some reason you cannot arrive until later that evening, just let us know and we'll do our best to pick you up then. If you choose to arrive a day or more early, we can pick you up in the area of Kailua-Kona or Kealakekua on Jan. 28.

Please plan your departure accordingly: We can deliver you to the Kona airport from 9am-5pm on Feb. 9. If your flight leaves late in the evening on Feb. 9, we can help you figure out where to be in Kona and how to get a taxi or shuttle to the airport. People often share a taxi for this purpose. Plan to leave our B&B by 10am on Feb. 9, after which we can drop you off in Kailua-Kona, if not at the airport.

Many flights come via Oahu (Honolulu Airport, code HNL) or Maui (Kahului Airport, code OGG), but some come direct to Kona from the mainland. There are direct flights from Oakland (OAK), San Francisco (SFO), Portland, Seattle, Los Angeles (LAX) and elsewhere. Airlines that fly into Kona are United, Delta, Hawaiian, and others. Many more airlines fly into Honolulu, and then you transfer to another flight or airlines to hop over to the Big Island.

Rental cars: You will *not* need a rental car during the time you are with our group. We'll be traveling on field trips in two 7-passenger vans. If you should want to rent one anyway, or to have a car for time on the island before or after the course, we recommend this site for the best prices and reliable customer service: Discount Hawaii Car Rental. They don't require a credit card deposit upon making reservations, and they work with all the rental companies, so you don't need to search them all.
